### Collingwood Preparative Women Meeting 1895 - 1898

Archives: 99 - 0 - 5

This minute book is held by the Canadian Quaker Archives and Library in Newmarket, Ontario. The Collingwood and Grey minute books were given to the archives in 1991.

Grey County, along the shore of Georgian Bay, was opened in the 1840's for settlement and a number of Quakers from West Lake, Pickering and Yonge St moved there. Slowly, Quaker communities grew large enough to justify building meeting houses. The Collingwood meeting house was built in 1861 followed by Sydenham and St. Vincent, both in 1866. Grey Monthly Meeting was formed in 1871 over the Collingwood and Sydenham Preparative Meetings (1866) and the indulged St Vincent meeting. The meeting was Orthodox. These meetings were all laid down by 1900. See the detailed article about these meetings in the Canadian Quaker History Journal, No. 49, pp. 3-10, 1991.
